

ERH dedicated to our best outcomes

ECHUCA Regional Health's rehabilitation ward has poured heart and soul into providing first-class treatment to the twin

And finally, it's been recognised for it.

The hospital was awarded Best Outcomes in Reconditioning Rehabilitation and Best Outcomes Ortho in Replacements Rehabilitation at the Victorian Australasian Rehabilitation Outcomes Centre (AROC) annual workshop recently.

There's a hole in NSW bucket

THE Ricegrowers' Association of Australia (RGA) says it is extremely concerned the Murray-Darling Basin Agreement has resulted in less water available to NSW Murray.

President Jeremy Morton said it was intolerable the current water sharing framework resulted in NSW share of water in the Murray system being reduced by 40,000ML.

"In its simplest terms South Australia's bucket of water has been full since April, the Victorian bucket continues to fill while the NSW bucket has a hole in it," he said.

"The RGA is convinced that a myriad of small and not so small changes to rules and codifying of water sharing arrangements is significantly impacting the share of the water resource allocated to NSW."

Mr Morton said the RGA wanted the Murray Darling Basin Ministerial Council (MinCo) to acknowledge the impacts and for conversation to start about how the water resources could be shared more equitably.

"This conversation will be a difficult one and and a good starting point is for MinCo to acknowledge that concessions have been made over many decades by NSW which have led to this intolerable situation," he said.

"We ask that MinCo commit to renegotiating provisions of the Murray-Darling Basin Agreement to address the inequity of the current water sharing arrangements.
